Assistant Professor in Lawyering

ALBANY LAW SCHOOL seeks highly qualified candidates for entry-level positions teaching Introduction to Lawyering, a six-credit, first-year course. The positions will be long-term contract track or tenure-track depending on interest and experience of candidates. Successful candidates will teach two sections each of the course, which integrates legal research, writing, analysis, interviewing, client counseling, fact investigation, drafting, negotiating, and appellate advocacy. As members of a collegial and integrated faculty, lawyering faculty participate in faculty governance, advise students, and fully engage in the intellectual life of the law school.

Applicants must have a J.D., a superior academic record, at least five years of experience in law practice, and the desire and potential to become excellent teachers. Candidates seeking placement on a tenure-track must have a proven ability to produce thoughtful scholarship.
